No.9/1/91-DP(ST/SC) : In exercise of the powers conferred under sub-section (1) of Section 19 of the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1977 (Manipur Act No. 1 of 1977), the State Government, after inviting suggestions/objections from the general public and after taking into consideration all relevant aspects, suggestions and objections received in this regard, hereby makes the following *Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Rules, 2011*.

**MANIPUR RESERVATION OF VACANCIES IN POSTS AND SERVICES (FOR SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES) RULES, 2011**

1. **Short title and commencement.**- (1) These Rules may be called the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Rules, 2011.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. **Definitions.**-In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:-

- (a) "Act" means the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1976 (Manipur Act No.1 of 1977);
- (b) "Form" means a Form appended to these Rules;
- (c) "Schedule" means the Schedule appended to these Rules;
- (d) "Section" means a section of the Act;
- (e) All other words or expressions used in the Rules but not defined herein shall have the same meaning as are respectively assigned to them in the Act.

3. **Model Roster.**- Separate model rosters for Direct Recruitment and Promotion shall be as maintained in **Schedule I and Schedule II**.

4. **Maintenance of register for appointment.**- (1) The Registers of appointments for direct recruitment and promotion against reserved posts shall be maintained separately in **Form-I** and every appointing authority shall treat vacancies as reserved or unreserved as indicated in model rosters prescribed under rule 3.

(2) Separate registers shall be maintained for direct recruitment and promotion as well as for each type of recruitment separately for each grade, or service or group of posts.

(3) Immediately after an appointment has been made, the particulars of the person appointed will be entered in the appointment column of the prescribed register and the entry marked as "Utilised" by such category signed by the appointing authority or by the officer authorised to do so by the appointing authority.

(4) The roster is to be operated on the principal of replacement and not as a "running account" as hitherto. In other words the points at which reservation for different categories applies

are fixed as per the roster and vacancies caused by retirement etc. of persons occupying those points shall be filled by appointment of persons of the respective categories.

**5. Eligibility of age to the recruitment.-** (1) Within any year of recruitment, the conditions of eligibility by age or otherwise should remain the same even if recruitment is made more than once in that recruitment year, that is, if a person who was eligible on the date of first application in the year, he shall not be disqualified on the ground that he is no longer eligible by the time the relevant vacancy (against which he could have been appointed) arose in that recruitment year.

**(2) In any competitive examination conducted either by MPSC or any recruitment/selection board, SC, ST, OBC candidates who qualify under open category shall not be recommended against vacancies reserved for them.**

**6. De-reservation of vacancies.-** Direct Recruitment vacancies reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes shall not be de-reserved and filled by general candidates. In case adequate numbers of candidates are unavailable then the following procedure is to be followed:-

- (a) (i) The unfilled direct recruitment vacancies reserved for Scheduled Tribes or Scheduled Caste, as the case may be, in any recruitment year shall not clubbed together with the vacancies arising in subsequent recruitment year. The unfilled vacancies are to be treated as a separate group and the reservation of the posts for Scheduled Tribes or Scheduled Caste shall not be affected by the fifty percent ceiling on reservation.
  - (ii) The unfilled direct recruitment vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are to be notified in the print and electronic media. Separate requisition may be sent to the Manipur Public Service Commission or the Employment Exchange as applicable by endorsing a copy of the requisition to the Department of Personnel.
  - (iii) The State Government, if it considers necessary in view of the performance of the Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste candidate in the earlier examination, may relax the qualifying marks or lower the standards of evaluation as provided under section 9B.
- (b) In case of promotion vacancies reserved for Scheduled Tribe or Scheduled Caste, the vacancies are to be filled by candidates who are eligible and fit for promotion, and are in the normal zone of consideration. If the vacancies remain unfilled due to unavailability of candidates within the normal zone of consideration, then the zone of consideration will be extended as prescribed by the Department of Personnel, Government of Manipur vide O.M. No.17/2/80-DP dated 29-4-1999 and eligible candidates shall be recommended to fill up the balance vacancies. If some reserved vacancies continue to remain unfilled after following the above procedure only then candidates belonging to the unreserved category, subject to the condition that the reservation is carried forward to the next recruitment year, shall fill the unfilled reserved vacancies. Some of the unreserved vacancies arising after the last recruitment will be treated as reserved based on the actual number of reserved vacancies filled by the unreserved category.

**7. Promotion made by Selection:-** In promotion made by Selection, the following procedure shall be followed for filling the reserved vacancies :-

- (a) Promotion made by selection in or to from Class III to Class II, within Class II and from Class II to the lowest rung or category in Class I in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 75% :-

Selection against vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes will be made only from those Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Officers who are within the normal zone or the extended zone of consideration as prescribed by the Department of Personnel, Government of Manipur vide O.M. No.17/2/80-DP dated 29-4-1999.

- (i) If the number of candidates from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes promoted on the basis of merit with due regard to seniority without any relaxation is less than the number of vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, the difference shall be made up by selecting candidates of these communities who are in the normal zone or the extended zone of consideration irrespective of merit vis-a-vis candidates belonging to unreserved category provided they are fit for promotion.
  - (ii) A select list shall then be prepared in which the names of all the selected officers, unreserved as well as those belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are arranged as per the principles and guidelines prescribed by the Department of Personnel vide its O.M. No.17/2/80-DP dated 29-4-1999. In case of organised services, which have its own Service Rules, the procedure laid down in the Rules would be followed.
  - (iii) The "Select List" shall be periodically reviewed. The names of those officers who have been promoted (otherwise than on a local or purely temporary basis) and continue to officiate, shall be removed from the list and the rest of the names along with others who may now be included in the field of choice shall be considered for the select list for the subsequent period.
  - (iv) Where promotion in the above manner are first made on a long term officiating basis, confirmation shall be made according to the general rule viz. that an officer who has secured earlier officiating promotion on the basis of his place in the select list should also be confirmed earlier, and thus enable him to retain the advantage, provided that he maintains an appropriate standard.
- (b) Promotion in Class III and Class IV in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 75% :-

For such post, the select list of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Officials shall be drawn up separately from among the officials coming under the zone or the extended zone of consideration to fill up the reserved vacancies. Officials belonging to these classes shall be adjudged separately and not along with other officers and if they are fit for promotion, they shall be included in the Select list as per the guidelines and principles prescribed by the Department of Personnel vide its O.M. No.17/2/80-DP dated 29-4-1999.

**8. Promotion made on the basis of seniority subject to fitness.** In promotion to Class I, Class II, Class III and Class IV made on the basis of seniority subject to fitness, the following procedure shall be followed for filling the reserved vacancies:-

- (i) Wherever according to the points in the roster there are any vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, separate lists shall be drawn up of the eligible Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes Officers, as the case may be, arranged in order of their *inter se* seniority in the main list.
- (ii) The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes Officers shall be adjudged by the Departmental Promotion Committee separately in regard to their fitness.
- (iii) When the Select Lists of officers in the general category and those belonging to Scheduled Tribes have been prepared by the Departmental Promotion Committee, these should be merged into a combined Select List in which the names of all the

selected officers, general as well as those belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, are arranged in the order of their *inter se* seniority in the original seniority list of the category or grade from which the promotion is being made. This combined select list should thereafter be followed for making promotions in vacancies as and when they arise during the year.

- (iv) The Select List thus prepared would normally be operative for a period of one year. This period may, however, be extended by another six months to enable promotion of officers included in the select list but could not be appointed to the higher posts during the normal period of one year.

**9. Payment of Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance.**-(1) The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes candidates appearing for competitive examination, written test or interview conducted by the Manipur Public Service Commission or any other Selection Board, shall be paid Travelling Allowance and Daily Allowance at the rate prescribed by the State Government from time to time.

The terms and conditions for payment/re-imbursement of TA/DA are as given below:

- (a) Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates appearing for competitive examination/interview conducted by the MPSC or any other Selection Board will be eligible for re-imbursement of Daily Allowance including train fare by 1<sup>st</sup> Class and Bus fare also if such fare for journeys to and from the place of residence to the place of examination/interview.
- (b) The re-imbursement shall be made by the Secretary, MPSC in the case of examination conducted by the MPSC and the appointing authority in the case of examination taken by the Department concerned.

(2) The concessions mentioned in sub-rule (1) shall not be admissible to the candidates who are already in service under the State Government or the Central Government.

**10. Annual Return:-** (1) Each appointing Authority shall furnish Annual Report by the 31<sup>st</sup> July of every year to the concerned Department of the Government, as follows :-

- (a) A statement in **Form - II** showing the total number of Government servants and the number of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes amongst them as on 1<sup>st</sup> April of the year.
- (b) A statement in **Form-III** showing the recruitment and the number filled by Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes during the year ending 31<sup>st</sup> March.
- (c) A statement showing number of permanent posts filled up by Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes as on 1<sup>st</sup> April as shown in **Form- IV**.
- (2) Each Department of Government shall furnish to the Department of Personnel by 31<sup>st</sup> October every year -
- (a) A statement in **Form-II** and **Form-III** in respect of all offices under its control including its own.
- (b) A consolidated statement in the form given in **Form-IV** in respect of all offices under its control including its own.
- (c) In the statements referred to in Rule 10 (2) (a) (b), Department of Government Offices or the Heads of Departments and Subordinate Offices shall be shown separately.

**THE MANIPUR RESERVATION OF VACANCIES IN POSTS AND  
SERVICES (FOR SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED  
TRIBES) ACT, 1976  
(Manipur Act No. 1 of 1977)**

**AN  
ACT**

*to provide for adequate representation of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in posts and services under the State of Manipur.*

BE it enacted by the Legislature of Manipur State in the twenty seventh year of the Republic of India as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Manipur Reservation of vacancies in posts and services (for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1976.

Short title  
& extent.

(2) It shall extend to the whole of State of Manipur.

(3) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government, by notification, appoint in that behalf.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(a) "Prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;

Definition.

- (b) "Recruitment Year" means the financial year during which a recruitment is actually made;
- (c) "Reservation" means reservation of vacancies in posts and services for the Scheduled Castes/Tribes;
- (d) "Scheduled Castes" shall have reference to the Scheduled Castes specified in the Constitution (Scheduled Castes) Order, 1950 made under Article 341 of the Constitution of India and as amended from time to time;
- (e) "Scheduled Tribes" shall have reference to the Scheduled Tribes specified in the Constitution (Scheduled Tribes) Order, 1950 made under Article 342 of the Constitution of India and as amended from time to time;
- (f) "Select list" means the list of candidates arranged in order of precedence prepared according to the rules and orders issued by the State Government in that behalf and adopted by the competent authority for making appointments in respect of initial rectt. and promotion;
- (g) "State" includes the Government and the Legislature of the State of Manipur, Autonomous District Councils and all other local authorities within the State or under the control of the State Government and any Corporation in which not less than 51% of the paid up share capital is held by the State Government.

Application

3. This Act shall apply to all appointments to the posts and services under the State except—

- (a) those meant for conducting or guiding or directing research;
- (b) those classified as scientific posts;
- (c) tenure posts;
- (d) those filled up on the basis of any contract;
- (e) ex-cadre posts;
- (f) those which are filled up by transfer or deputation;
- (g) those in purely temporary establishments, such as work-charged staff including daily-rated and monthly-rated staff and such staff the duration of whose appointment does not extend beyond the term of office of the person making the appointment;
- (h) temporary appointments of less than forty-five days duration;
- (i) those in respect of which recruitment is made in accordance with any provision contained in the constitution; and
- (j) such other posts as the State Government may, from time to time, by order, specify:



Provided that all orders made under clause (j) shall, as soon as after they are made, be laid before the State Legislature for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one or more sessions.

4. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this Act, the vacancies reserved for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes shall not be filled up by candidates not belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

(2) The reservation of vacancies in Posts and Services shall be at such percentage of the total number of vacancies as the State Government may from time to time, by order published in the official gazette determine :

Provided that

- (a) in the case of initial recruitment, the percentage so determined shall, in no case be less than the percentage of the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes, as the case may be, in the total population of the State as recorded in 1971 Census;

Provided that if there be only two vacancies, the roster points must be ensured after taking into account the carry-over of the percentage of the preceding three recruitment years; and

- (b) save as otherwise provided in this Act in the case of appointment by way of promotion, the percentage of reservation shall be equal to the percentage as on the 1st day of April, 1976 of the employees belonging to the Scheduled Castes or Schedule Tribes, as the case may be, in the lower grade from which the promotion is to be made so, however, that it shall not exceed the percentage of the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes in the total population of the State.

4A 5. (1) The State Government shall prescribe model rosters indicating the number of vacancies to be reserved for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes and the number to be left unreserved.

(2) The appointing authorities shall maintain rosters in the prescribed form.

(3) The rosters shall be consulted for ascertaining the number of reserved vacancies but the appointments against the reserved vacancies shall be made in accordance with the order of precedence of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates as shown in the select list.

6. The reserved vacancies in appointments shall be exchanged between the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the event of non-availability of candidates from the respective communities, but the vacancies reserved for a particular community shall continue to be reserved for that community only for two recruitment years and if candidates are not available for appointment in particular reserved vacancies in the third year, the vacancy so filled by exchange shall be treated as reserved for the candidates of that particular community who are actually appointed.

Dereservation

7. If, in any recruitment year the number of candidates either from Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes is less than the number of vacancies reserved for them even after exchange of reservation between the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, the remaining vacancies may be filled up by general candidates after dereserving the vacancies in the prescribed manner, but the vacancies so dereserved may be carried forward to subsequent three years of recruitment.

Provided that such carry forward should also be permitted in respect of vacancies so dereserved in preceding three years prior to enforcement of this Act.

Provided further that in the years following the recruitment years the normal reserved vacancies together with the vacancies carried forward shall not exceed fifty percent of the total number of vacancies of the year in which recruitment is made and the excess over fifty per cent of reserved vacancies shall be carried forward to subsequent years of recruitment.

8. For initial appointment:—

- (a) the upper age-limit prescribed for recruitment shall be increased by five years;
- (b) fees prescribed for admission into any competitive examination or interview for recruitment shall be reduced to one fourth;
- (c) the Scheduled Caste and the Scheduled Tribe candidates shall be paid travelling allowance to attend competitive recruitment examination or interview by Manipur Public Service Commission at such rate as may be prescribed.

Process of

9. (1) For recruitment through Employment Exchange in the requisition sent to the Exchange, the number of vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes shall be specified against the total number of vacancies.

(2) For recruitment made through the Manipur Public Service Commission or any Selection Board on the basis of competitive examination or interview, the advertisement shall specify the number of vacancies reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes against the total number of vacancies.

Substituted



(3) The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates shall be recruited to the extent of the reserved vacancies if they possess the minimum qualifications required for the posts or services.

Provided that the pass marks, in all the recruitment examinations, for the Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste candidates, in the aggregate may be relaxed by the State Government or M.P.S.C.

Provided further that in the case of reserved vacancies in non technical and quasi-technical Class III and the Class IV posts the Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste candidates who fulfil the prescribed educational qualification but have failed the prescribed test may be recruited on probation against the remaining reserved vacancies subject to passing the prescribed in service training course within the period of probation.

(4) If the required number of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates are not available for filling up the reserved vacancies, a fresh recruitment may be made only from candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes, as the case may be for filling up the remaining reserved vacancies.

(5) If the required number of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Caste or the Scheduled Tribes are still not available or if the number of such candidates is less than the number of reserved vacancies, the vacancies which remain unfilled shall be filled by general candidates in accordance with procedure laid down in sections 6 and 7.

10. (1) Where promotion is to be made on the basis of seniority subject to fitness, the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Officers shall be promoted to the next higher posts or grade against reserved vacancies provided they possess the minimum qualifications and experience required for such promotion.

(2) The number of reserved vacancies shall be determined on the basis of the reserved points shown in the roster maintained under section 5.

11. Where promotion is to be made on the basis of selection and the element of direct recruitment does not exceed fifty per cent, the procedure for filling up of the reserved vacancies shall be as may be prescribed and the number of reserved vacancies will be determined on the basis of the reserved points shown in the roster maintained under section 5.

12. Where selection is to be made from different services the recruiting or appointing authority shall select Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates to the extent of the reserved quota, provided such candidates satisfy the minimum conditions of suitability, qualifications and experience laid down in respect of the posts concerned.

13. In posts/services filled by direct recruitment on temporary basis reservation is required to be made for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes at the time of confirmation.

14. (1) Every appointing authority shall furnish to the Government in the prescribed manner an annual report on appointments by the end of the month of July of the succeeding financial year and maintain such other records as may be prescribed.

(2) Any Officer authorised by the State Government in that behalf may inspect any record or documents and require the appointing authority to produce the roster and other records relating to appointments made by him which are maintained by his Office.

(3) It shall be the duty of the appointing authority to produce such records and documents, furnish such information and afford all such assistance and facilities as may be necessary for the aforesaid purpose.

Responsi-

15. In each Department of the Government, the Head of Department shall be specially responsible for:—

- (a) ensuring proper implementation of the provisions of this Act and rule made thereunder;
- (b) ensuring compliance by the subordinate authorities;
- (c) ensuring timely submission of returns;
- (d) conducting annual inspection of roster and such other records as may be prescribed;
- (e) ensuring necessary assistance to the Tribal Welfare Department and the Hill Commissioner in the investigation of complaints received from organisations or individuals belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.

Standing  
Committee.

16. (1) There shall be a Standing Committee consisting of the following members, namely:—

- (a) Minister in charge of Tribal Welfare — Chairman.
- (b) Chief Secretary — Member.
- (c) Two M.L.As. belonging to Scheduled Castes and/or Scheduled Tribes to be nominated by the State Government. — Member.
- (d) Secretary (TW). — Member Secretary.

Provided that on issue of a proclamation under Article 356 of the Constitution of India, the composition of the Committee may be altered by the State Government to such extent as they deem fit.

Function of  
the Standing  
Committee.

17. The Standing Committee shall perform the following functions, namely:—

- (a) review of the implementation of the provisions of this Act and the rules made thereunder, twice in a financial year;
- (b) suggesting measures for the removal of difficulties in such implementation or for the improvement thereof; and



- (c) such other functions as the State Government may, from time to time, assign to the committee.
- (d) an order issued by the State Government under Clause 3(j) shall be placed before the Standing Committee, when the Legislature is not in session. Such order shall later be placed before the State Legislature in accordance with the provision of clause 3(j).

18. The State Government shall prepare an annual report on the working of this Act and lay the same before the Legislative Assembly for a period of not less than fifteen days in the Budget Session of the succeeding financial year.

Annual report to be laid before Legislative Assembly.

19. (1) The State Government may, after previous publication make rules to carry out all or any of the purposes of this Act.

Power to make Rules.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, they may make rules in respect of all matters expressly required or allowed by this Act to be prescribed.

(3) All rules made under this Act shall, as soon as may be after they are made, be laid before the State Legislature for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one or more sessions and, if during the said period, the State Legislature makes modifications, if any, therein the rules shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form, so however, that such modifications shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under the rules.

20. The provisions of this Act shall have effect notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other law or in any rule, order or resolution made by the State Government.

**SECOND AMENDMENT ACT, 2007**

Manipur Act No. 6 of 2007

An

to amend the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1976 (Manipur Act No. 1 of 1977).

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Manipur in the Fifty-eighth Year of the Republic of India as follows :

1. Short title and commencement.—(1) This Act may be called the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (For Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Second Amendment Act, 2007.

(2) It shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint.

2. Amendment of section 2.—In clause (g) of section 2 of the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1976 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), after the words 'by the State Government', the words "or any other authority in respect of which the State Legislature has the power to make laws" shall be inserted.



3. Amendment of section 3.— Clause (d) of section 3 of the principal Act shall be deleted.

4. Substitution of section 4.—For section 4 of the principal Act, the following shall be substituted, namely,—

\* “4. Percentage of vacancies to be reserved—

(1) Subject to the provisions of section 3, there shall be reservation at such percentage of the total number of vacancies in services and posts as the State Government may, from time to time, by notification in the official Gazette, determine for Scheduled Tribes and Scheduled Castes respectively in—

(i) direct recruitments;

(ii) promotions made on the basis of competitive examination limited departmental candidates, within or to Classes II, III and IV posts, in grades or services in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 75%;

(iii) promotion made by selection from Class III to Class II, within Class II and from Class II to the lowest rung or category in Class I, in grades or services in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 75%;

(iv) promotions made by selection in or to Class III and IV posts, in grades or services in which the element of direct recruitment if any, does not exceed 75%;

(v) promotions made on the basis of seniority subject to fitness, in appointments to all Class I, Class II, Class III and Class IV posts in grades or services in which the element of direct recruitment, if any, does not exceed 75%.

(2) Every notification or order made under the sub-section (1) shall be laid before the State Legislature in the manner specified in sub-section (3) of section 19 of this Act.

5. Insertion of new section 4A—After section 4 of the principal Act, the following new section 4A shall be inserted, namely, —

“4A. For the purposes of this Act, any unfilled vacancies which are for being filled up by the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, as the case may be, in any recruitment year or years shall be treated as separate class of vacancies to be filled up in any succeeding year or years and such vacancies shall not be considered together with the vacancies of the year in which they are being filled up for determining the ceiling of fifty per cent reservation on total number of vacancies of that year.”



6. Deletion of section 6.-Section 6 of the principal Act shall be deleted.

7. Amendment of section 7.- In section 7 of the principal Act- #

(i) for the words "reserved for them even after exchange of reservation between the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, the remaining vacancies", the words "reserved for them, the remaining vacancies shall be kept unfilled in case of appointment by direct recruitment and no dereservation of such unutilized reserved vacancies for direct recruitment shall be allowed. However, in the case of appointment by promotion, the remaining reserved vacancies which cannot be filled in a recruitment year due to non-availability of adequate number of eligible candidates from the reserved community" shall be substituted;

(ii) in the second proviso, in between the words "is made" and "and", the words "in respect of promotion only" shall be inserted.

8. Amendment of section 9.-For sub-section (3) of section 9 of the principal Act, the following shall be substituted, namely,-

"(3) The Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates shall be recruited to the extent of the reserved vacancies :

Provided that the pass marks, in all the recruitment examinations, for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates, in the aggregate may be relaxed by the State Government or Manipur Public Service Commission."

9. Insertion of new sections 9A, 9B, 9C and 9D.—After section 9 of the principal Act, the following new sections 9A, 9B, 9C and 9D shall be inserted, namely,—

"9A. Procedure of making promotion against reserved vacancies.- The procedure of making promotion to posts and services against vacancies reserved for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes shall be as prescribed.

9B. Relaxation of qualifying marks, standards of evaluation, etc. for promotion.—The State Government may relax the qualifying marks in any examination or lower the standards of evaluation in favour of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes for reservation in matter of promotion to any class or classes of services or posts.

9C. Advertisement in Direct Recruitment- If the required number of candidates of Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes are not available for filling up the reserved vacancies, fresh advertisement may be made only for the candidates belonging to the member of the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes, as the case may be, to fill the backlog or remaining vacancies.



9D. Concession- Fees, if any, prescribed for any examination for selection to any service or post shall be reduced to 1/4 in the case of candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes."

10. Amendment of section 11.- The words "the element of direct recruitment does not exceed fifty percent" occurring in Section 11 shall be substituted by the words "the element of direct recruitment does not exceed seventyfive percent"

11. Deletion of section 13.- Section 13 of the principal Act shall be deleted.

12. Amendment of section 15.- The full stop "(.)" at the end of clause (c) of section 15 of the principal Act, a colon "(:)" shall be substituted and thereafter the following proviso shall be inserted, namely,-

"Provided that in the event of failure of Administrative Department Head of Department to comply with the provisions of this Act, he shall be liable for disciplinary proceedings against him as per service rules applicable."

13. Substitution of section 16.- For section 16 of the principal Act, the following shall be substituted, namely.—

"16. Standing Committee,- (1) There shall be a Standing Committee consisting of the following members, namely,-

Provided that on issue of a proclamation under Article 356 of the Constitution of India, the composition of the Committee may be altered by the State Government to such extent as it may deem fit.

(2) One officer belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribes, not below the rank of Under Secretary shall be posted in the Department of Personal who shall act as Nodal Officer for implementation of this Act."



14. Insertion of new section 16A.—After section 16 of the principal Act, the following new section 16A shall be inserted, namely:-

**"16A. Prevention of disqualification for membership of State Legislature.—**  
It is hereby declared that the Chairman or member of the Standing Committee under section 16 of this Act shall not be disqualified and shall be deemed never to have been disqualified for being chosen as, or for being a Member of State Legislature."

15. Insertion of new sections 18A and 18B.—After section 18 of the principal Act, the following new sections 18A and 18B shall be inserted, namely,-

**"18A. Protection of action taken in good faith.—**No suit, prosecution of other legal proceedings shall be against any person for anything which is done in good faith or intend to be done under this Act.

**"18B. Removal of difficulties.—**(1) If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the State Government may take such steps or issue such orders not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as the State Government may consider necessary for removing the difficulty:

Provided that no order shall be made under this section after the expiry of two years from the date of commencement of this Act.

(2) Every order made under this section shall be laid before the State Legislature in the manner specified in sub-section (3) of section 19 of this Act."

16. Amendment of section 19.—(1) In section 19 of the principal Act,-

(i) for sub-section (2), the following shall be substituted, namely-

**"(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of foregoing power, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-**

- (a) manner and guidelines for determining the ceiling of fifty percent of reservation of the vacancies of the year under the provision of section 4A of the Act and Clause 4B of Article 16 of the Constitution of India;
- (b) the procedure and guidelines of promotion on the basis of seniority;
- (c) procedure of selection by the recruiting of appointing authority in respect of candidates who satisfy the required qualifications and experience as per the recruitment rules;



- (d) manner and guidelines on filling up of reserved vacancies both direct recruitment and promotion;
  - (e) maximum age limit for recruitment to any service or post
  - (f) any other matter which is to be or may be prescribed.
- (ii) in sub-section (3), for the words "All rules made under", the "All rules, notifications or orders", shall be substituted

**Subject :** Reservation in Promotion - Conditions to be complied with, for effecting reservations in promotions by all Departments of the State Government and their subordinate offices, public sector undertakings, State Government Societies/Agencies, statutory bodies, etc.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgement dated 28.01.2022 in Civil Appeal No. 629 of 2022 {(arising out of SLP (C ) No. 30621 of 2011) (Jarnail Singh & Ors -Vs- Lachhmi Narain Gupta & Ors)}, has observed that "the State is not bound to make reservation for SCs and STs in matters of promotion. However, if it wishes to exercise its discretion, the State has to collect quantifiable data showing backwardness of the class and inadequacy of representation of that class in public employment, in addition to compliance with Article 335 of the Constitution of India."

2. Reference is invited to DP's OM No.9/1/21-Res/DP dated 27.11.2021 on the subject.
3. The State Cabinet has revisited the matter on 21.07.2022 and has decided to adopt/follow a similar exercise as contained in DoPT's OM No.36012/16/2019-Esttt.(Res.) dated 12.04.2022.
4. Based on the State Cabinet decision dated 21.07.2022, it is reiterated that while implementing the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Act, 1976 and the Manipur Reservation of Vacancies in Posts and Services (for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) Rules, 2011, as amended from time to time, the conditions set out by the Hon'ble Supreme Court for the purpose of implementing the policy of reservation in promotions must be satisfied by the State Government.
5. The conditions are as follows:
  - (i) There must be inadequacy of representation of Scheduled Castes (SC) and Scheduled Tribes (ST).
  - (ii) Inadequacy must be determined on the basis of quantifiable data. Collection of information / quantifiable data regarding inadequacy of representation of SCs and STs cannot be with reference to the entire service or 'class'/group' but it should be relatable to the grade/category of posts to which promotion is sought.
  - (iii) 'Cadre' should be the unit for determining inadequacy.
6. All Departments are required to ensure that the above conditions are complied with, before implementing the policy of reservation in promotion and carrying out reservation based thereon.



7. While considering proposals for promotion involving reservation in promotion for SC or ST or both, all Departments are also requested to ensure the following:

- (i) Policy of Reservation in promotion as codified in the Act/Rules applicable to the State of Manipur is for promotion to cadres in Group B, C, D and for promotion from Group B to cadres in lowest rung of Group A.
- (ii) While cadre is generally to be construed as the number of posts in a particular grade, for the purpose of preparation of roster, it shall be comprised of posts required to be filled by a particular mode of recruitment in terms of the applicable recruitment rules. To illustrate, in a cadre comprising 200 posts, where the recruitment rules prescribe a ratio of 50:50 for filling up on the basis of direct recruitment and promotions respectively, the roster for direct recruitment shall have 100 points and that for promotion shall have 100 points – thus making a total of 200.
- (iii) All posts for which a separate roster is maintained will constitute a separate cadre.
- (iv) Inadequacy of representation will be determined with respect to posts within a cadre. Illustrations for guidance are given at the Appendix.
- (v) While complying with the conditions as stipulated above, a clause shall be mentioned in all promotion orders to the effect that "the promotion order shall be subject to further orders that may be passed by the Supreme Court in Jarnail Singh batch of cases".
- (vi) The Administrative Secretary concerned shall ensure that the reservation rosters are maintained as per the instructions/guidelines, laid down in DP's OM No.9/6/2007-SC/ST/OBC/DP(Pt) dated 03.03.2011 and Notification No. 9/1/91-DP(ST/SC) dated 17.05.2011, as amended from time to time.
- (vii) In order to ensure maintenance of efficiency of administration, the DPC shall carefully assess the suitability of the officers/officials, being considered for promotion.
- (viii) The Appointing Authority shall issue the appointment / promotion orders only after satisfying itself that the conditions mentioned above have fully been complied with.

8. The illustrations at Appendix does not apply to those ST/SC officials who did not avail any type of relaxation at the time of initial appointment. However, it will be applicable to those ST/SC officials who have availed the relaxation, even if they are placed higher than UR officials in the Seniority List being considered for the promotion.

9. It is reiterated that conditions laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in its judgement dated 28.01.2022 in the above mentioned cases must be complied with.

10. This OM shall come into effect from the date of publication in the official Gazette of the State Government.

11. All Departments are requested to urgently bring these instructions to the notice of all their attached / subordinate offices as also the public sector undertakings, State Government societies / agencies, statutory bodies, etc. for adherence and strict compliance.
